My Job-Bill Izzard

One of our newest members Bill Izzard gave us an illuminating commentary on his career working on newspapers which started locally at *The East Anglian Daily Times*.

Bill was appointed as a junior reporter by Donald Simpson (a former President of this Club) largely as Bill hinted because he had been educated at Ipswich School. After 6 years – 5 as a reporter and a final year as a sub-editor – Bill moved on helping to launch *Sports Magazine* and *Citizens Newspaper*. He was also involved with launching the Angle and then moved to "Fleet Street" with *Sunday Sport* followed by a spell with *The European* newspaper which was part of the Robert Maxwell empire.

Bill gave an interesting insight into Maxwell's *modus operandi* in that sales of that paper were being presented at a level of 1.3million per week whereas in reality 1.0 million of those were never read but were being bought up by a Maxwell subsidiary company for pulping.

Bill moved to *The Sun* and before going back to *The European* which by then was in the ownership of the Barclay brothers.

In 1997 he was made redundant but while at a wedding reception he was offered a job with *The Daily Star* where he spent the next 20 years. There he met Piers Morgan who passed on to Bill the pearl of wisdom that if news was sparse he should resort to some front page epic that was weather-related because of our obsession with the weather. However Bill's proudest journalistic moment was to produce the banner headline proclaiming "Psycho Seagull Stole my Dog" – a story, which had previously made it to p.17, about the loss of a chihuahua in Devon to a marauding gull. This story had more credibility than the one about Freddie Starr (allegedly) eating a hamster.

Since retirement Bill has become a keen gardener thus moving on from "dishing the dirt" to "digging it!".

New Event Board Methodology

Event Boards will be generated by the Event Organiser (EO) and passed to the club secretary for info containing the following proposed event details:

> Event name/description/venue/start date/time The closing date of board for event The estimated cost per person of event Any event constraints (e.g. restricted access) Any limited number advice (some events, by their nature, have a cap on numbers)

- A physical board will still be circulated at meetings; however the EO now takes responsibility for that circulation and the recovery of physical board each week. Simultaneously the EO will supply the event detail to the newsletter for publication.
- Members attending meetings will indicate whether they will participate or be absent as normal.
- Members wishing to participate who are not at meetings will (prompted by the newsletter advice) contact the EO directly, preferably by email, to indicate interest.
- Members wishing to subsequently add / revise / cancel existing numbers will either alter the physical board if pre close date, or contact the EO (preferably by email) if unable to revise the physical board at a meeting.
- If cancellation is requested after board close date (and the club has made irrevocable financial commitment) the member will always be held accountable for cost unless the EO is able to replace with another member. Mitigation of this position in special circumstances will only be by agreement of Club President / Club Secretary.
- Where events are limited numbers and are oversubscribed, the EO will randomly select members to participate (other than themselves, president, VP, JVP, Secretary and partners). The event manager will advise successful participants and then manage a short list if required.
- The event organiser will in all cases generate a list of participants and circulate (via the club secretary) after the closure date. Where other info e.g. menu choices are required those details will be circulated directly by the EO at a later date.
