

Mark Murphy[:] Cancer Campaign in Suffolk

On Tuesday 7 th November, the Club was delighted to have as "guest" speaker our very own Mark Murphy talking about his new role as CEO of Cancer Campaign in Suffolk.

After 33 years presenting shows on BBC Radio Suffolk, Mark said he was really excited to be facing a new challenge leading CCiS, whose mission is to focus on life before, during and after cancer, educating the local community about the signs and symptoms before a cancer diagnosis, supporting cancer patients during treatment and providing follow-up assistance and wellbeing programmes thereafter.

CCiS is now based in a splendid period building in St Margaret's Street, just below Christchurch Mansion, from where its team of counsellors and experts provide advice, support and wellbeing. Referrals to the charity mainly come from Ipswich Hospital.

Mark highlighted several of the challenges currently facing CCiS. Although the charity has been in existence for 25 years, public awareness of its valuable role within the local community needs to be raised. There are plans to rebrand as Cancer Support Suffolk. Raising funds both to support cancer patients and to run the charity's premises and administration is a constant challenge, as is



raising awareness of the signs and symptoms of cancer, particularly among the male population who seem to be much less willing to take advantages of CCiS's services.

At this point, Mark handed the microphone to Mick Rudkin, who bravely recounted his own experience as a cancer patient and emphasised the need to seek early treatment wherever possible.

As one would expect from a seasoned professional, Mark's presentation was eloquent, polished and informative, and President George gave the vote of thanks.
