


Matt Brinkley and Paul Sergeant - New therapy and sensory gym

Our guest speaker on 21st November was Matt Brinkley of Therapy Gyms, supported by his business partner Paul Sergeant. Paul's first contact with Rotary was with Ewan Dodds at the Decoy checkpoint of the Orwell Challenge.

Matt Brinkley qualified as a personal trainer in 2008, but soon realised that there was a need for more accessible exercise for people who required additional support and guidance, not just going to a regular gym. One particular example was a man who was paralysed from the waist down – he and Matt ended up as very good friends and attended each other's weddings.

The main Therapy Gym is at Holton St Mary (just off the A12 between Ipswich and Colchester) but the team of trainers can also visit customers homes or premises, an example being the Thomas Wolsey School where they spend 3 hours every week.





Therapy Gyms cater to a range of fitness related therapy needs, providing a holistic approach to wellness. They collaborate closely with healthcare professionals such as general practitioners, physiotherapists and occupational therapists and can tailor their services to meet clients' specific needs and requirements.

Therapy Gyms reputation and expertise soon came to the attention of Active Suffolk, who wanted them to expand, and in 2022 a new community interest company was launched called Making Fitness Accessible. Over 2300 people are now being supported.

Matt demonstrated fantastic passion for his work and commitment to helping the community. Rightly, this was appreciated in Lucy Trenchard's vote of thanks on behalf of the Club.

Wild Apricot Refresher

Steve Runnacles gave an update on the Wild Apricot System to the Club at lunch on 14th November 2023. The presentation featured an update on using Wild Apricot via a browser on either a laptop or a tablet and also by using the Mobile Phone App.

The first part of the presentation dealt with using Wild Apricot through a browser and Steve outlined the weblink to give access to the site as follows:


www.rotaryclubofipswicheast.wildapricot.org

Once you have reached the website you gain access to your member area by typing:

Your username: this is your usual email that you receive lunch invites from, and

Your Password: If you can't remember this, please hit the reset password, or contact Steve Runnacles or Lucy Trenchard.

The home screen is as shown below – Steve drew members' attention to the menu options across the top of the page and the Balance on the member account shown in light blue text in the bottom right-hand corner of the screen.



Steve then went on about how you book in for lunch if you have a credit on the system. When booking for lunch in these circumstances, Members should book in for lunch as usual but should hit the "Invoice me" button rather than the "Pay Online" button.

This will mean that no monies will be taken form the member's credit card account. If there is a shortfall after using the invoice me button, the member can pay the difference at lunch via the Club Card machine. Please see the next page to see the relevant screen shot showing the invoice me button outlined in red. Steve went on to show members how they could alter their own details and view other members contact details.

Members were reminded of the implications of Data Privacy and the need to ensure that other members' personal details are not issued to third parties without their prior consent.

Finally, Steve gave a brief overview of using the App via a mobile phone. In particular, he listed the benefits in both security and convenience of accessing Wild Apricot via this method.

He set out that the App can be obtained via the Apple and Android App Stores and easily installed on a mobile phone.

Once installed, members can log in using their usernames and passwords in exactly the same manner as accessing Wild Apricot via a browser.

Steve showed how the App gives access to events as soon as they are listed on the system and how members can keep a track of the events they have been to. The App also has a comprehensive directory showing details of each member.

With the year drawing to an end and our change in lunch venue imminent, I thought it would be helpful to remind members that from **Tuesday 2nd January** the new venue for our lunches will be the **Ipswich & District Indoor Bowling Club** at 136 Rushmere Road, Ipswich IP4 4JU. This is accessed



from the Rushmere Road just before the roundabout/ junction with Colchester Road.

Please park up in the large car park and make your way to the main entrance. The entrance to the building is locked but please press the

buzzer to gain entry and someone will be there to let you in.

For the first lunch date, there will be a Rotarian to guide you to the Club Room where you will be met by your Duty Rotarian as usual. For those who do not know the club, the Club Room, where we will be sitting down, is along the walk way in front of the indoor bowling green near the end, and a sign over the door says 'Club Room'.

There is a bar inside the Club Room so please ensure you purchase your drinks from there rather than the main club bar, which you will pass on your way to the Club Room.

Unlike our current arrangements, coffee is not generally served at table but is set up on a side table. I would like to suggest that each table elects one person to do the coffee for the table, otherwise we will have 30+ people queuing for coffee and may hold things up whilst the speaker is delivering their speech.

The one big change for members is the deadline for registering for lunch. Please note that Friday lunchtime is the new deadline, NOT the usual midnight on Sunday.

If anyone has any queries on these arrangements please let me know as soon as possible, otherwise, I look forward to greeting you to this new venue on **2nd January 2024**.
