

RECENT MEETINGS AND EVENTS

Tony Grover - Rotary Membership

On Tuesday 3 June Tony Grover, the District Membership Lead, visited the Club to speak about membership. He recommended members to attend the District seminar to be held on Saturday 7 June which would be entirely focussed on increasing membership of Rotary.

Tony complimented Ipswich East on maintaining a membership of over 60 Rotarians but encouraged the Club to continue to look for new members.

He encouraged members to build on the reputation the Club had developed in the community with such events as the Orwell Challenge which, if kept in the public eye, might encourage new people to consider membership.

It was important for all members to present Rotary in a vibrant, diverse and positive way to the outside world and look to friends, colleagues and the business world for potential members.

He recommended that the Club should look at ways in which existing members could continue with membership in the traditional style and enjoy Rotary as they had done so over the years. However at the same time it was important to identify new different types of membership which might bring new people into the Club without the

commitment of lunches and membership fees. Tony emphasised the importance and usefulness of social media in this quest.

The Satellite Club was a classic example of the way that Ipswich East had sponsored a different and dynamic type of membership.

Answering questions Tony said that the Assistant District Governors were well placed to identify failing Clubs and to facilitate, where appropriate, mergers or transfers to ensure members were not totally lost to the movement.

He said it was important to utilise the way in which Clubs across the District could share good practice and assist other Clubs with membership projects.

President Steve thanked Tony for visiting the Club and that the information he had presented would be taken on board as the Club continued its drive for new members.

Musicians are judged by the live performance of the works or works of their choice and which at national level must be within a time not exceeding 13 minutes

Recognising those who have demonstrated positive citizenship, personal achievements, assumed important responsibilities, undertaken community activities or otherwise stood out as exceptional

Using whatever medium entrants choose they decide and develop their own ideas around the theme endeavouring to raise awareness and inspire action to respond to the issues



Up to and including 10, 11-13 and 14-17

To produce one photograph based upon the theme. Mobile devices or cameras may be used and the digital photograph must be at least 1500 pixel in size on the longest length



Up to and including 10, 11-13 and 14-17

Handwritten or typed entries can either be a story in prose (up to a maximum of 550 words) or a poem (up to a maximum of 40 lines)

There will no national final for either of the two face to face competitions below and each Rotary District and Cluster will decide if they run one, both or neither
