

### RECENT MEETINGS AND EVENTS

### Lewis Tyler - Daddy, What is Television?

On Tuesday 17 June, we were treated to a presentation by 'one of our own', Lewis Tyler. He said that the presentation was recycled or, should I say, a "repeat" of an earlier presentation. Notwithstanding this, he kept the audience enthralled with a talk that covered the history of television technology and equipment, early programming and presenters and even his family business. The talk was supported by a number of slides that brought back memories for many of the members present.

Lewis started by asking who remembered watching the 1953 coronation on television and several members responded positively. He then asked about the 1937 coronation with less success. Although not allowed in the Abbey, the 1937 procession was the first outside broadcast in the world.

As Lewis pointed out, television was invented some way before 1937, as attempts were made to transmit

pictures for a number of years. The inventor credited with the first successful transmission of pictures is John Logie Baird, who became known as the father of television. There followed a battle between Baird and EMI to develop a universal system which was won by EMI.

Prior to the second world war, signal coverage was limited to the wider London area, including Colchester and erratically Ipswich. The programmes began for one hour in the afternoon and one hour in the evening and no Sunday TV. Lewis can remember watching Mickey Mouse, Felix Mendelssohn and Big Bill Campbell with presenters Elizabeth Cowell, Jasmine Bligh and Leslie Mitchell.

The system was shut down during the war because of the risk of bombers following the signal but resumed immediately after the war, and developed quickly with new technology. New TV models were produced by Bush and Murphy. The signal improved with further transmitters installed, including one at Manningtree. New presenters became household names and new programmes (including the famous *Muffin the Mule*) were made. The public demanded more programmes and ITV launched in 1955 with Anglia starting in 1959.

On a more personal level, Lewis explained that his father started the family business 167 Felixstowe Road in 1926 before moving to 191 Felixstowe Road





a few years later, where Lewis was born and where he was based all his working career. It is thanks to his father that Lewis got interested in televisions and enjoyed a career spanning more than 45 years.

Lewis showed his certificate issued by Murphy to allow the business to sell Murphy televisions. He also explained that the business installed what was probably the first TV afloat on HMS Woolwich and described the early colour TVs as "the most complicated contraptions imaginable". However, I am sure that Lewis tackled them with the same level of skill he showed giving his entertaining talk enjoyed by all. A repeat perhaps, but one well worth hearing.
